### **Privacy Policy**

This document relates to our use of any personal information you submit to us via this website. This policy explains what information we collect about you, what we do with the information, who we share the information with, and how you can to contact us if you have any queries.

What information do we collect about you?

We may collect, store and use the following kinds of personal information:

- Information that you provide to us for the purpose of creating an account (including login name, password, forename, surname and email address).
- Information that you provide to us for display on your member profile page.

What do we do with the information we collect?

Personal information submitted to us via this website will only be used for the purposes specified in this privacy policy. We may use your personal information to contact you.

Who will we share your information with?

We will not without your express consent provide your personal information (including your email address) to any third parties, unless we are required to do so by law, excepting that which you provide for display to other site users on your member profile.

Your email address will not be visible on your profile page or in the member directory if you tick the "Withhold Email Address" tickbox on your account page. Other site users will still be able to send you messages through the site's private messaging facility.

### **Cookies**

A cookie is a small text file that is sent to your computer from a website and stored on your computer's hard drive. A website service can only access the cookies it has sent to you and not the cookies sent to you by other websites. You can stop a certain website or all websites from sending you cookies using the privacy settings of your web browser. However, this may have a detrimental effect on the operation of the website.

We use "session" cookies (which are deleted from your computer when you close your browser) on this website. We use them to provide the 'login' facility and access to members only pages.

In general, cookies are used to retain user preferences, store information for things like shopping carts, and provide anonymised tracking data to third party applications like Google Analytics. As a rule, cookies will make your browsing experience better. However, you may prefer to disable cookies on this site and on others. The most effective way to do this is to disable cookies in your browser. We suggest consulting the Help section of your browser or reviewing

the "About Cookies" website at [www.aboutcookies.org](http://www.aboutcookies.org) which offers guidance for all modern internet browsers.

We use Google Analytics which may be used to collect visitor statistics to help us improve this website. Google Analytics uses cookies to track visitors and store information, such as what time the current visit occurred, whether the visitor has been to the site before, and what site referred the visitor to the web page. We may use third-party advertisements supplied by Google or other trusted organizations to help support this website. Google uses cookies (including the DART cookie) to serve adverts based on your visit to the site and other sites on the internet.
