New Boarding Houses

In order to improve still further the standard of accommodation and facilities provided, the Governors have decided to build two new boarding houses, each to hold some 50 boys, a housemaster and his family, to be ready for occupation in September, 1989.

The purpose of this development is not to allow an increase in the number of pupils; Rendcomb is to remain a small school, where everyone knows everyone else and a family atmosphere can be maintained.

STABLE HOUSE

The houses have been planned to provide for work and recreation, for privacy and social activity, combined with excellent pastoral care; they include study bedrooms for all pupils in their fifth year and beyond.

Boys from Primary Schools will spend their first two years in the Junior House, joined in Godman House in their third year by the entrants from Preparatory Schools. This third year will allow boys to get to know all their contemporaries before moving to one of the three senior boarding houses for the rest of their time at Rendcomb.
